Admin Instructions: Duty status is TDY. AETC funds travel, lodging, and per diem. The 479 OSS prearranges billeting. Reservations are held under the name "Introduction to Electronic Warfare" or "IEW". IEW Course Director or Flight Commander will email attendees the reservation number prior to students' arrival. Attendees are responsible for confirming billeting reservations with NAS Pensacola billeting, DSN 922-2755 or Comm (850) 452-2755. Walking to meals and lodging is impractical. Unit funding of a rental car is mandatory.

<u>Prerequisites:</u> IEW is open to all officers, enlisted and DoD civilians. Students must have a Secret before entering class. Clearances will be verified via JPAS prior to class. Attendees do not need to submit a visit request.

Graduates of IEW are eligible to attend the Electronic Warfare Coordinators Course (S-V8E-S).

IEW introduces basic electronic warfare (EW) concepts to include science, doctrine, and application. Graduates will be familiar with the three pillars of EW; Electronic Support, Electronic Protect, and Electronic Attack. Additionally, graduates will be instructed on the capabilities of a variety of air, space, and ground EW platforms. IEW is ideal for pilots of EW aircraft, Intel officers and enlisted, acquisitions and testing professionals.
