On June 28, 2019, the AOC Capital Club Scholarship Chair, Donald (Don) Revell (Colonel, U.S. Marine (Ret.)) enjoyed the privilege of meeting and presenting the Capitol Club's most recent scholarship award to Virginia Tech student Bryce Flowers in Blacksburg, Virginia. Bryce is currently working on an emerging technology research project that involves the fusion of RF Engineering and Adversarial Machine Learning.

After presenting Bryce with a \$2,500 scholarship award, Colonel Revell was given a tour and briefing of Virginia Tech's Ted and Karyn Hume Center for National Security and Technology by Dr. Chris Headley, assistant director of the Hume Center's Electronic Systems Laboratory and research assistant professor, by courtesy, with the Electrical & Computer Engineering Department. The Hume Center leads Virginia Tech's research and experimental learning programs in national security with a focus on aerospace and oceans engineering, electronics systems and information systems. The Hume Center holds Center of Academic Excellence designations from the National Security Agency, the Department of Homeland Security and the Intelligence community.
